

Elections to the Assembly of the British Community

The administration of the British Community (BC) will determine elections to the Assembly of the BC in each of its administrative entities. They will appoint representatives by one person one vote of residents of the BC to determine aspects of the organisation of the BC.

The composition of the Assemblies will reflect within 1% the distribution between males and females in the population of the BC of those who so designate it and the age of those 13 years or older.

The conduct of these elections will be determined by an internationally recognised authority with competence in the conduct of elections.

By similar means elections to the BC will be authorised as valid by a body independent of the BC with investigatory powers. If such an election is deemed invalid or fraudulent, it will re-run, and the BC will not have the powers to prevent this.

The purpose of the Assemblies of the BC will be to set up detailed advice on the running of the BC and its administration.

Assemblies of the BC may decide to coordinate their policies in these cases.
