

## **The Russian fascist elite**

Revolutions come, revolutions go, and everything stays the same.

The main difference between the Soviet Union and the West, was that in the West everyone thought they knew what was going on, whereas in the Soviet Union everyone knew that they did not.

I became aware, right after the end of the Cold War, of the interests of the Rothschilds in Russia. They even wrote a book about it.

The situation of the Soviet gerontocracy was similar but more extreme than the UK gerontocracy today. We may remark that for the rich today, death is an optional and uncertain event. Sharon in Israel ruled whilst he was dead, so in the end did Franco in Spain. We note the situation in Israel has changed a little since. We are confronted with a Prime Minister, Netanyahu, who rules the country from his prison cell. It is a side-issue that there has become not the distinct possibility, but the practicality, that medical advances mean we can be ruled by zombies. The zombie is a very interesting idea in African culture. A zombie is half-alive and half-dead.

Gorbachev sought to reform a system that was indubitably corrupt. He had ample reason to believe this and was fortunate in being selected by the elite as the only suitable candidate who had not died off.

This task was exceedingly dangerous, and he did not have the support to carry it through. A system with a power elite does not have the resources within itself to accomplish a revolution from below.

Be aware that laughter at its high command is an essential component of a democratic system.

The intention of the power elite in Russia was to subvert it. The intention of the capitalist class who intended to invade, was by secret means to assist them in this task. In this, socialist planning was a foremost requirement.

Over a long period of time Russians may have forgotten that they overturned the capitalist system in a decisive act of revolt at the status quo. They may even have forgotten, but I doubt it, that Nazi Germany was a high-point of that capitalist development, and they resisted it with considerable success.

They may have thought that someone who staggers about in a permanent state of inebriation is not the ideal person to chart the transfer to a new society.

The Roman Empire, under Marcus Aurelius had as head of state a man of outstanding ability. He was not only a philosopher, which was the reason for his appointment, but an astute and accomplished administrator.

We have this situation in Russia today. Vadim Putin is your Marcus Aurelius. He is not as good, but he is well able to attain his objectives. His aim, as I understand it is the aggrandisement of Russia, and the incorporation of those who once persecuted it in a system of total control. For this, a necessary accompaniment is the suitable elevation of himself.

Men live and men die, and the system evolves.

The Roman Empire had many Emperors, all of less ability than Marcus Aurelius. Underneath, the system of slavery below and high corruption above had many instances. To take an example, the Emperor Tiberius had a villa at Capri. The modern reader will recoil in shock at its brutal perversions, but he was not the worst. The worst was Caligula. He was a lunatic, but that was only a symptom of a greater malaise. The accounts of his period in office that I have seen are censored to nonexistence. Beware, Russians, Caligula is in the wings.

The payment by Russians to their cronies in the UK Parliament and elsewhere is utterly blatant and astonishingly direct. The appointment of Trump in the US, who is entirely in accordance with their views, comes as a shock to those that assumed the democratic system had some vestigial aspects of validity.

It seems, in a remarkable volte-face that the centre of the capitalist system has relocated from the US to Russia. This is not entirely so, but it has distinct developmental possibilities which are being implemented day by day. In Russia, this capitalist elite is indubitably and totally corrupt.

The system of propaganda has itself been subject to propaganda adjustment. It is called the media. Media control and bribery today are far more effective than brutal suppression in the past. We are confronted with a supine population who readily subject themselves to indignities in the belief that it is imposed by a type of democratic system which does not exist.

Russians today are confronted by the idea that serfdom is relative, and is not what it used to be.
